

- Avionics Technician Aircraft Maintenance 2 years
- Aviation Technician Avionics Maintenance 2 years
- Aircraft Structural Repair Technician 1 year

Candidate Selection Criteria

Applicants will complete a series of short answers and an interview. The successful applicants will be selected based on the following criteria:

- Short answer responses,
- Interview,
- · Letter of recommendation, and
- For Indigenous hiring, the student must provide proof of status.

Aviation Technician - Aircraft Maintenance 2 Years

Learn to troubleshoot vital aircraft components and systems, including piston and turbine engines, electrical systems, hydraulics, and navigation and communication systems. Study the challenging complexities of fixed and rotary wing aircraft while gaining the theoretical knowledge you need for apprenticeship employment. This program is approved by Transport Canada. Required OSSD or equivalent, ENG4C or ENG4U, Gr. 12 Math (C), or (U).

Aviation Technician - Avionics Maintenance 2 Years

Train under skilled professionals to repair and maintain aircraft electrical and electronics systems. You learn equipment installation practices and techniques, flight management and flight guidance systems communication and surveillance systems, navigation systems and aircraft instrumentation, and more. This program is approved by Transport Canada. Required: OSSD or equivalent, ENG4C or ENG4U, Gr. 12 Math (C), or (U). Recommended courses include: Gr. 12 Math (MCT4C).

Aircraft Structural Repair Technician 1 Year

Graduate with skills that make you highly sought-after. Learn structural assembly and repair, fabrication repair, forming techniques, and composite manufacturing and repair techniques. This program is approved by Transport Canada. Required: OSSD or equivalent, ENG4C or ENG4U, Gr. 12 Math (C), (U) or (M).
